ICAN is a federally funded program of New Mexico State University whose mission is to inspire New Mexico's limited resource youth and adults to make healthy food and lifestyle choices.

In **Bernalillo County**, ICAN employs 2 paraprofessional SNAP-Ed Nutrition Educators and one professional Family and Consumer Science Agent.

In FFY 16, Bernalillo County SNAP-Ed reached a total of 2,357 adult participants and 1,844 youth participants.

## BERNALILLO COUNTY SNAP-Ed



Throughout summer, SNAP-Ed staff visited summer program sites to teach **1,844** youth the importance of drinking water with fruit infused water recipes. Several centers adopted serving fruit infused water instead of offering costly sweetened beverages.
